

A lofted wedge with little bounce, like the one in the photo, should be used for the lob shot. The bounce on the bottom of the club helps if you hit a little behind the ball the club will slide along the ground and have more margin for error.

Remember this shot is dangerous and should only be used if you have no other choice to get the ball close to the hole and only after you have successfully practiced the lob shot and have the confidence to use it on the course.

(If you have real trouble hitting the shot it probably means there is a mistake in your swing and you should have a PGA Professional instructor help you with your full swing.)
